Margaret Byrne Sarricks was a former Professor at the University Of Kansas. She dedicated her career to educating future professionals within the field of communication disorders. She served as President of the Kansas Speech- Language-Hearing Association and President of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. She had received the Honors of both Associations during her dedicated career. In 1995, the KSHA Executive Board named this scholarship in her honor and memory.

KSHA Student Scholarship Guidelines

The Kansas Speech-Language-Hearing Association has made scholarships available to encourage reporting of student research at the annual KSHA Convention. Participation by student KSHA members will be supported by these funds and will require the presentation of a poster at a special session during the convention.

1. The number of scholarships awarded and the amounts of each will be determined by the scholarship committee in accordance with the policies set forth and approved by the Executive Board of KSHA. Recipients are expected to register for the convention. The Executive Board of KSHA has agreed to furnish a luncheon ticket for each student presenter. Each presenter will be recognized at the luncheon when the actual monetary awards will be made.

2. Without exception, presenters must attend the convention and be present in order to receive their funds. In addition, the Program Committee will be responsible for providing an opportunity at a specified time period for the students to present their posters. It is the responsibility of the Executive Board to inform the Program Chair of the convention about this scholarship program and the scholarship recipients. To avoid confusions, the general call for papers will not include a call for student posters.

3. Applicants must have been student members of KSHA on March 1, of the year they are submitting a research proposal for this competition. Their name must appear in the current year KSHA Directory. It is not permissible to join KSHA at time the proposal is submitted for consideration nor shortly before. The student shall not have graduated more than one year prior to the presentation.

4. Call for Scholarship Proposals shall be sent to the faculty member representing each training program. In the November/December issue of the Connection, a reminder will be placed notifying all programs and members of the requirement for student membership by **March 1** to be eligible for participation in this program. In addition, the KSHA Connection shall include a short notice early in the calendar year. The proposals shall be due no later than May 15 unless the date published in the Connection is later. Dates are subject to slight changes.

5. Applicants must be current or recent degree candidates at any of the four academic programs in communicative disorders within Kansas. A maximum of one award will be made to students who are in or have completed doctoral training. The master's or doctoral degree must not have been awarded more than one year prior to the actual presentation date. Multiple authorship is acceptable for this competition.

6. Proposals should be research projects providing clinical or theoretical information. Reviews of literature and other non-data-based projects are not appropriate. Only completed research should be submitted. The study must have been completed while the student was enrolled at one of the speech-language pathology, audiology, or speech and hearing science programs within Kansas. There must be a faculty sponsor from within the program where the study was conducted.

7. Students will submit a 500-1000 word summary of their work, inclusive of a list of references, as well as a more limited 50-word abstract. The summary should include a rationale for the study, detailed description of the methods employed, detailed findings and conclusions. In general, proposals should follow APA format. Six copies of the cover sheet and proposal should be submitted to KSHA Central Office by the date published in the Connection of the year that it is to be considered. Faxed proposals will not be accepted.

8. Proposals will be judged on overall quality, scientific merit, well-defined focus, organization, and content.
